Call to Action by AAUW Norelynn Pion-Goureau, Public Policy Chair

Today the expected moves against Title IX have occurred and AAUW is urging members to react quickly. Women on campuses will have less protection from sexual assault and reporting if these measures are adopted and may not feel safe on campuses and stop their education. Educational equality is a hard won right. The following are three actions members are requested by our national board to take:

1. <u>Sign AAUW's petition</u> calling on Secretary to DeVos to withdraw the proposed regulations.

2. <u>Submit a Letter to the Editor</u> to your local paper to help educate others in your community about what's at stake – winning over public opinion will be key to our fight.

3. <u>Share AAUW's petition with friends, family, branch members, and neighbors.</u> It's crucial that advocates speak up — loudly — and fight back against any attempts to diminish critical protections for students.
