

Public Policy:

Current Issues and What You Can Do


AAUW members had the pleasure of hearing speaker Cardozie Jones on the subject of race in the United States, prefaced by a short policy update by the author of this article on two important upcoming bills AAUW is supporting, which aim to impact low-wage earners in the Federal government and also increase the minimum wage. Both of these proposed laws impact women and address the particularly low wages and economic security of African American women.

African American women who work full time and year-round make on average only 61 cents on the dollar compared to white men, significantly less than the estimated 87 cents on the dollar white women make. The Economic Policy Institute found that African American women would particularly benefit from the two proposed legislative pieces--the Paycheck Fairness Act (H.R. 7) and the Raise the Wage Act of 2019(Sen 150/H.R. 582)--because they are overly represented in low-paid work. Raising the federal minimum wage to \$15 by 2024 would give 31% of all working women a raise, including 41% of black working women. These are vital pieces of both a gender and race-focused economic security agenda.

AAUW's research shows that women of color experience intersecting and compounding

forms of race and gender discrimination that contribute to their economic inequality. (https://www.aauw.org/research/thesimple-truth-about-the-gender-pay-gap/)

Call or contact your representative to support these two important pieces of legislation for women's economic progress and security. Race-based economic injustice needs to be addressed and made visible.
